

How do I apply?

There are a limited number of Fellowship spots available for the 2010-2011 year. Spots will be given to students on a first-come, first-served basis. In order to qualify you must:

1. Agree to sign a statement saying that you will actively support and live by the values of the Pres House Residence community.
2. Agree to participate in ALL Pres House Fellowship program activities (4 per semester, one planned by Fellowship participants each semester). These activities will be announced in the Spring or Summer of 2010.

Once accepted you must sign a standard 12-month Pres House Residence lease within 15 days of acceptance and provide all standard residence forms, security deposits, etc. when requested by management to confirm your fellowship spot.

Looking for a way to build deeper, more intentional relationships with the people that live in your building? The Pres House Fellowship is designed to help you get connected with other residents who share your values and are committed to fellowship together.

Students selected for this program will agree to actively support the values that lie behind the Pres House Residence (see back flap).

You will also be expected to participate in **4 program events per semester** (additional optional events may also be offered). These events will be tied to the four Residential Community Values. They will be non-sectarian and interfaith in nature. Some will have spiritual components. The activities will be designed to benefit you and build fellowship and friendship among program participants. One event per semester will be planned and run by the Fellowship participants.

Scholarship.

We don't want the cost of the Pres House Residence to prohibit you from living here or participating in the Pres House Fellowship program. For that reason, all participants of the Fellowship will receive a 20% scholarship applied to your rent in the Pres House Residence.

- A meet and greet or lecture from the UW Madison Chancellor or Dean of Students
- A service project in Madison
- A seminar on personal finance
- A seminar about forgiveness or interfaith meditation
- A meet and greet with a local politician or visiting scholar
- An outing just for fun

Pres House Residence Fellowship

The Pres House Fellowship is designed to further Pres House's mission of "providing high quality student housing to promote the spiritual, emotional, and intellectual growth of residents and members of the campus community."

The word "fellowship" has two meanings here. First, the word describes a community of people invited to make friends with each other and have community fellowship together. Second, the word is used in the sense of an academic fellowship, or scholarship: funding that allows a student to do something you wouldn't otherwise be able to do.
